Frankincense – A sweet-smelling resin used in <u>worship</u> ; it symbolizes his priesthood and divinity.	The prayer and adoration we are to give God. (Rev. 8:3-4)
Myrrh – An ointment used in burial, myrrh represented His humanity, <u>death</u> , and burial.	Our daily self-sacrifices to the Lord.
