**Bishops Appeal for Vocations** – Thank you for your gifts for the education of future priests! Please return your pledge cards to the weekend volunteers or in the tithing basket. Our goals at Weston and Touhy are \$7,900 and \$2,400.

**World Mission Sunday Collection** – Next weekend, October 19/20, is the collection. This collection is dispersed by the Vatican to approved missions in countries most in need.
